Diane graduated from the Peabody Conservatory of Music in 1972. She has released 11 albums and has been honored as Best Female Soloist of the Year by the National Evangelical Film Foundation. Diane's goal in singing is to honor Christ with a ministry to the minds, hearts and souls of people. Diane married evangelist Ron Susek in 1968 and is a regular soloist for her husband's ministry, Susek Evangelistic Association.

Buddy King is a familiar name in Central Pennsylvania and is best known for his time with the soul group, The Magnificent Men, in the 60's and 70's. After dealing with years of alcohol abuse, Buddy realized he was not living the kind of life that God prepared him for, and entered a Christian-centered recovery program. He is now sounding better than ever. Buddy's dynamic sound and powerful message make his performances uplifting to one and all.

Diane and Buddy now frequently perform together. Their performances usually include both worship music, as well as songs that people know from Buddy's early pop days. We always have a great time when they perform for us at Hayshire!

Pastoral Reflection

On Trinity Sunday, we heard in the Proverbs 8 scripture how we are called to be in community with God. Not just, called, but created to be in community with God and that God yearns for us to claim our place within that circle of beloved ones. This is an echo of Genesis 2 where we read how God daily came and spent time with Adam and Eve in the garden.

To me, this idea of being in community with God takes our relationship with God to a new level. I encourage you to stop and think about that for a minute.

- What is your relationship with God really like?
- Is God one of your true confidants?
- Is God one of the first “people” you turn to with your good news as well as your bad?
- Can you imagine spending time with God just like you do your closest friends – chatting over coffee or tea, having a relaxing drink in the evening, just hanging out and joking around the fire pit, or over dinner?

This does take the idea of spending time with God to a whole new level. I think for a lot of us, no matter how much we spend time in prayer with God, and even when we see God as a close friend, there is still an element of formality to the relationship – at least there is for me.

For July, I’m going to work on that portion of my relationship with God. I’m going to try and take it to the next level. Maybe you will too. Think about an activity that you love to do with your favorite people – fishing, chatting over coffee/tea/etc., going for a walk..... and commit to doing that with God at least once a week through the 4 weeks of July. Talk to God about the things you would your closes friends – the good and the bad. Don’t ask for anything more than you would from your closest friends, just be with God, and share with God. Then jot down some of your thoughts and observations after each session, and at the end of the month, look at how your relationship, your comfort level, your prayers have changed. How do you feel about God now? Do you find it easier to come to God with your thoughts, feelings, needs, joys throughout the day? Are you spending more time with God?

I hope that this new way to spend time with God leads to a deeper, more joyful relationship. May your soul be filled and fed in new and exciting ways this month.

From your President---

The past Memorial weekend was one that I will treasure for the rest of my life. First, I need to supply some background information. The previous Saturday, much needed outside maintenance was done at Hayshire UCC. Over 30 bags of vegetation were collected. The fourth Saturday of every month, the township picks up vegetation. I offered to take the bags out to the road on Friday evening. One member wasn't sure the township would take plastic bags, while another member thought the township would split open the bags and take the vegetation. Since it was going to be a lot less work, I gambled they would split open the bags.

On Friday evening, I noticed that I was going to have take care of something else at church. I knew I was going to need to spend a couple of hours at church on Saturday morning, but I was hoping that the plastic bags would be gone when I arrived. Much to my chagrin, the plastic bags were exactly where I had left them. There was a note indicating they would not take plastic bags.

I have to admit, when I first started taking the bags to the shed, I was not in the best of moods. I knew I should have checked to see whether or not the township would take the plastic bags. Fortunately, my day and my entire weekend was about to change for the better.

An elderly gentleman, wearing a Navy cap, walked across the street towards me. His name is Earl Godfrey. His first comment was he couldn't believe the township did not take the vegetation. I assured him that I had nobody to blame but myself. He mentioned that it was a lot of work to take the bags back and he wanted to help. He offered to bring his pickup truck, so I could put the bags on his truck. I told him that would save me a lot of time and I appreciated him helping me.

Earl walked across the street and brought his pickup truck over. As I was loading bags onto his truck, he mentioned that he was 95 years old. I immediately asked him if he served in the Navy during World War II. Yes, he had and he described how he almost lost his life during the war as a 20 year old. A bullet went right through

a soldier that was in front of him and ended up hitting a can that was close by. The can exploded and permanently damaged his left hand and left arm. He had limited use of both the last 75 years of his life. It was obvious that with his close brush with death, Earl was grateful for all the things he did have.

It was an honor and privilege spending 15 minutes talking to Earl. I realize the set of circumstances that resulted in Earl & me being together truly was a blessing. Needless to say, my mood changed dramatically and I began to smile as I finished my work at church. What a wonderful man Earl is. I thanked him for helping make my job much easier that day and, more importantly, for the service and sacrifices he made for our country.

Moving forward, I will remember my encounter with Earl not only on every Veterans Day and Memorial Day, but many days in between. I want to say a big thank you to all of our veterans and also to all of those who have family members who have served in our military. Your commitment and dedication to this country is greatly appreciated.


