For some reason this song has been stuck in my head this morning as I came into the office. I don’t know that I can say “everything” is going my/our way, but there is a lot of great stuff happening.

Like many of you, Dawn and I are back to work in the church office “full-time” once again. We will be in Monday through Thursday each week from 9am – 1pm. Things are quickly settling back into a more normal rhythm for us. It’s good to be back in the office, and there is plenty to do this week as we prepare to welcome you all back into our beautiful sanctuary on Sunday, June 28th. I’m sure you have already read the information on the front page about what is expected of each individual attending in-person worship, meetings, and events for the weeks to come. Since change is inevitable, Council will keep you updated as we need to adjust our ways of worshipping and gathering together.
