Pastoral Reflections . . .

From the very first book of the Bible, God stated that rest and renewal were an essential part of a healthy spiritual life. We hear it in Genesis 2:2-3, when it states that on the 7th day, God rested and hallowed the day, he made the day holy, and then God proclaimed that every creature and human should treat it as holy, even making it the 4th Commandment given to Moses (*Exodus 20:8*).

Rest, time for personal reflection and discernment are essential to a healthy spiritual life. Jesus did his best to model this throughout the gospels. There aren't a lot of verses that actually state that Jesus was able to have "alone" time with God.

- The longest time Jesus spent alone in prayer and discernment was the 40 days he was in the wilderness following his baptism (*Mark 1:12, Matthew 4:1-11, Luke 4:1-13*)
- Matthew 14:13 tells us that immediately after Jesus heard that John the Baptist had been killed, he attempted to go away to a deserted place by himself. Only the crowds followed him, demanding his attention.
- After the feeding of the 5000, Jesus is finally able to grab a little time by himself upon the mountain to pray (*Matthew 14:23*)
- Before Jesus' arrest, he and a few disciples settle in the Garden of Gethsemane to pray (*Luke 22:39-44*)

How often do we intentionally schedule time to rest and to spend in a spiritual retreat with God? I would bet you would answer, I spend time praying every day (morning or evening). I don't need more than that, do I?

That's a great question. Do you think we should spend more than our regular prayer time to spend with God throughout the year? When something big is happening in your life, do you ever spend more time with God trying to make a decision about what to do? Jesus did. He spent 40 days in the wilderness before he started his public ministry. And he spent hours in prayer in Gethsemane before he was arrested, making sure he knew what God expected of him. That he wasn't following a false path.

Our lives are so full and busy, that we don't often slow down to hear God's still small voice, and to check and see if the plans we are planning for ourselves and the decisions we are making each day are in line with what God has planned for us. Jesus' prayer in Gethsemane should be ours as well, "let your will be done, God, not mine." (*Mark 14:36 and Luke 22:42*).

During my sabbatical, I will be spending time with God, and making sure that I remain focused on God's will for my life. I have a few books I am looking forward to reading, as well as getting some extra rest, and starting some new positive practices for myself while I am away.

Over the next month or so, may you also find time for a mini-retreat with God; to take some time to just "be" in God's presence – to rest, to relax, and to renew your spirit.

From your President . . .

There are times when the scripture lesson and/or sermon hit close to home. Sunday, August 16th, was one of those Sundays for me. Part of the scripture lesson was from Matthew Chapter 15, Verse 21 and mentions a demon that had been tormenting a mother's daughter. Brenda's sermon mentioned our faith and questioning God.

If you have spent time reading the bible, you realize that demons and mental illness are referenced quite a bit. Obviously, people throughout the entire lifespan of the human race have dealt with mental health challenges. As a society, how often is mental illness even discussed? When it is mentioned, it is in the context of an excuse for someone's actions rather the cause of someone's actions.

When it comes to physical health issues, I have some idea what to look for and how to react. Far from being an expert, at least I have had CPR training. Years ago, I visited my parents early one Sunday afternoon. As soon as I heard my dad's slurred speech, I knew he had a stroke. He needed to get to the hospital as soon as possible.

Mental health issues are a much different story. How do you deal with these challenges? I have two friends, one whose wife is bi-polar and the other had a girlfriend that was bi-polar. Also, I had an aunt that was schizophrenic and my ex-wife's brother was schizophrenic. I do not take mental illness lightly. Although, I knew of people with mental health issues, I never had observed the dark side of their disease until the very end of my mother's life.

My mother obviously had a form of dementia, not Alzheimer's. Although she was not officially diagnosed, there is a very good possibility she had vascular dementia. A situation in which delusions and hallucinations are part of someone's everyday life. As much as I tried to incorporate common sense into our conversations, I eventually realized that I just needed to listen to her for 10 to 15 minutes. After that, she was a joy to around. Yes, I did question God, on why my mother, who had to deal with so much adversity in her life, was living with so much paranoia at the end. Knowing that she was finally at peace, made it much easier to mourn the loss of her.

Recent events in my life have resulted in me once again questioning God. I have heard people say, no one is given more in life challenges than they can handle. Through conversations and texts with an individual, I realize this person has faced too many of life's difficult challenges. As a result, they are currently struggling to cope. I sincerely hope that they find peace and happiness to enjoy the rest of their life.

Please take mental health issues seriously. They certainly were around in biblical times and will be around for as long as the human race exists. My thoughts and prayers are with all of those suffering with mental illness and the love ones that are attempting to take care of them.

Preparing for Communion at Home

On the 1st Sunday of each month, we traditionally share communion together during worship. Even though we are unable to be together in person, we can still share this sacred meal by lending Christ our table.

Like for any meal, we often “set the table” prior to sitting down to eat. Here are some ways you can do that:

- Pick your spot – You may wish to lend Jesus your kitchen or dining room table – a place where 1 or more from your house can gather together for this blessed meal.
- You may want to put them on a lovely cloth or fabric that reminds you of a special time or a person deeply connected to you. You may want to add a candle that you can light before worship or maybe a plant or flower(s).
- Or if you wish to keep it simple like Jesus did, you can place it on a napkin with the cup next to it. Your communion space may be as fancy or as simple as you wish it to be.
- Select your bread – it can be a single slice, a roll, a small loaf, or even crackers. Something you alone or with others in your house may break and share.
- In some parts of the world tortilla, rice cake, and cassava are used as this element – which is defined not as a wheat product, but as the most common food of the people.
- Select and prepare a cup or cups of juice (it can be grape, cranberry, apple), or perhaps wine, water, coffee, tea – whatever is your preference and what you have available.
